Program overview

The Leadership for School Improvement program is facilitated by the Department's Education Improvement Branch (EIB), delivered in partnership with school and system leaders.

This leadership program is designed to support principals and school leadership teams having a school review in 2021/2022. It aims to support schools with their improvement agenda, to develop a precise plan of action, and to build shared ownership and collective impact to improve student outcomes.

Drawing from the EIB's work in school reviews, research and capability development, the program will support leaders' strategies in leading change focused on a detailed action plan for improvement aligned to each school's context and improvement agenda. The program will build on leaders' development of a continuous improvement culture in their school in fostering the growth of expert teaching teams, to mobilise their teams with clarity of vision and purpose, and strong instructional leadership.

The program is designed to support collaboration among schools to foster a culture of collegiality, collaboration, and a shared vision across all Queensland state schools.

Program objectives

Applied to each school's context and unique challenges, participants will:

- Focus on a precise plan of action
- Further develop their leadership team's shared ownership and distributive approach to collective impact
- Apply instructional leadership to develop a high-performance culture and foster growth of expert teaching teams
- Build on their empowered leadership mindset and strategies in building a team, setting the direction, inspiring change and sustaining momentum
- Work and learn with a network across other schools.
